If it's airconditioned, this will dry plants out so they'll need misting at times. The people in charge allow this to occur. Our September meeting is after that show.

I hope I see you all at our August meeting. Until then, keep safe and well.

PLANT OF THE NIGHT

This 'unknown' Cymbidium was given to me by my cleaning lady approximately five years ago. We did a swap more or less; I gave her 3 or 4 pseudobulbs of my red Cymbidium and she gave me a few bulbs of this yellow/gold one in return.

The orchid has been growing in our front courtyard garden which is quite protected. It is relatively warm as it is north facing and therefore receives the sun most of the day. In the summer I grow my cymbidiums where they receive the morning sun but in the winter I move them to give them significantly more sun.

For the first few years the plant increased in size but there were no flowers, which was probably due to the fact it was virtually neglected and was just watered along with my other pot plants.

Last year I changed the fertilising routine for my Cymbidiums after reading an article by a grower who used Neutrog Strike Back for Orchids very successfully (8:3:10 + trace elements). I use a bag of Searles Cymbidium and Bromilliad mixed with a bag of Searles Orchid Mix when I repot them in Spring.

Once a month, I place a measured amount of Strike Back around the edge of the pot as well as some in the middle and water it in. I tend to water twice a week and occasionally give them some Seasol. All my cymbidiums seem to have improved in condition and have more flowers.

As a novice, I was thrilled to be awarded 'Plant of the Night'.
