Dendrobium Buderim Cream x Dendrobium Seigyoku 'Queen'

I won the original plant at a raffle in 2005. This is the best flowering I've had on this plant.

Buderim Cream was hybridised and registered in 1986 by Mrs B Mead of Buderim. She used Den. Highlight and Den. Yuzuki as parents. Den. Seigyoku was hybridised by Yamamoto in 1982. Parents are Den. Oberon and Den. Spring Wind. Den. Seigyoku was used in many of the Yamamoto hybrids in the 1980s and 1990s.

To get a good display of flowers, the plant has to be a couple of years old in the same pot. For this plant, I tied the old canes together in the middle and allowed the new canes to grow up on the outside. There was plenty of watering and fertilising starting late spring and into summer to make the canes grow and fill out. Tying the canes is the trickiest part. This has to be redone regularly during the growing season to ensure they don't become strangled by the tie. My shade house is 50% black shade cloth. I usually put my plants out into full sun after Easter but this depends on how hot the sun is at that time.

Come September, enjoy the flowers.
