Despite the challenges, there's a silver lining: these same tropical conditions, paired with the care many of you gave your orchids during Spring and Summer reporting and fertilising, are starting to pay off. Blooms are beginning to appear, brightening benches and bringing smiles to faces. It's a great reminder of the rewards this hobby offers when we give it our attention and care.

#### PLANT OF THE NIGHT

#### Vanda Kulwadee Fragrance 'BlackSpot'

I bought this plant in June 2016 at the Diamond Festival of Orchids from Alice's Orchids from Townsville. I transferred it into the basket in 2017. It has grown steadily and flowers regularly. It is in the northeast corner of the same shade house as the cattleyas, dendrobiums and other orchids with 50% black shade cloth covering the house.. Hopefully, they get more sunlight and warmth from this position. In winter, it is rather cold in the shadehouse, so I put solarweave over that corner as well as the solarweave around the south and western sides.

I fertilise with a combination of products. HSO-12 Flower is the usual fertiliser and I add Hy-San, a bio disinfectant. Recently, I added Peter's Excel Cal/ Mag Finisher to the regime. I also spray with magnesium sulphate (Epson Salts) twice a year. I try not to over do the spraying for insects and diseases, but I do control problems when they appear.
